A school breakfast is available for your child at James McGee Elementary. The breakfast is available in the cafeteria from 8:40 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. If your child is eligible for a free or reduced lunch, he/she can also receive a free or reduced breakfast. You will receive a form for applying for the free and reduced meal program. If you think you may qualify, fill out the form and return it to school. Forms will be available in the school office throughout the year. Nutrition Services allows students to charge 3 breakfast meals and 3 lunch meals and owe up to \$10.80. They will provide a cheese sandwich for students that have a negative balance of \$10.80. The cashier will give a negative balance note to each child owing money and when the account balance is low.

If you wish to pay weekly or monthly, please send a check or money in an envelope marked with your CHILD'S NAME, ROOM NUMBER AND AMOUNT OF MONEY. Your child can take it to the Food Service Cashier in the cafeteria. (Monthly menus will be sent home.)



Snacks/Birthday Treats/Class Parties

Due to the high number of students with severe allergies and dietary restrictions, **it has been decided that only non-food items should be brought to school to share for student birthdays.** Suggested items to bring could be pencils, erasers, bookmarks or purchase a book for the classroom or library in your child's name. Please make arrangements with your child's teacher. You could also elect to not bring anything to share. This policy is in place for the safety of all students. Thank you for your cooperation with the implementation of this policy. It will help ensure a safe learning environment for all students.



Student Deliveries

Please **do not** have balloons, stuffed animals, candy, or flowers brought, dropped off or sent to the office for students. It is very disruptive to have these items taken to classrooms. They can also be a safety hazard on the bus, and may not be allowed on the bus (for example balloons are not allowed on the bus).
